CLUB COMPETITIONS FOR GENTLEMEN

The categories of members eligible for entry to a particular competition are indicated by the following letter-code:

M, Full Members; C, Cadet Members; A, Associate Members; F, Five-day Members; J, Junior Members (see special conditions for junior entries). In addition, please refer to the General Notes on Competitions, Weekend Rules and the General Regulations

MONTHLY MEDAL: Normally on the first Saturday/Sunday of each month, in two divisions according to handicap. Open to: M,C,A,J - (see notes). Form of play on Medal Day Competitions 2 & 3-balls only (no four-balls on the course).

MONDAY MEDAL: Open to: M,C,A,F,J

CENTENARY CUP: Open to M,C,A,F. Best 4 medal scores returned (April - September) but excluding medal knock-out rounds.

THE CHALLENGE CUP: Summer competition, singles match play. Open to: M,C. Full handicap difference.

THE BOWEN TROPHIES: Summer knock-out competition, four-ball match play. Open to: M,C. 3/4 difference of handicap

JUBILEE CUP : Summer knock-out competition. Singles match play. Open to A,F only. Full handicap difference.

THE KNOCK OUT MEDAL: Open to M,A - Full handicap.

SUMMER ECLECTIC COMPETITIONS: Held on Wednesday evenings, April to September, a rotating series of 12 holes are played each evening. Stableford played off Full Handicap, in two series with a break of one week in between. Winners of the individual series compete in a play-off for the Tom Brown Trophy. Open to: M,C,A,F,J

WINTER SCRATCH TROPHY: Winter knock-out match play competition played off scratch. Open to 9 and lower handicaps only. Open to M,C,A,J

HORACE RAWLINS WINTER HANDICAP SINGLES KNOCK-OUT MATCH PLAY COMPETITION: Open to 10-28 handicaps. Played off full handicap. Open to M,C,A,F,J

THE MOXHAM TROPHIES: A knock-out foursome match play competition running through the winter. Winners qualify for Daily Mail Foursomes. Open to: M,C. 1/2 difference of combined handicap.

PAULIAN JUGS: Winter greensomes match play, played on the 4-ball side of the course. Open to M,C. 3/8 of difference of combined handicap.

THE COXON-SALE CUP: Medal round on first Sunday in April for qualifiers in the past year's Monthly Medal competitions. Open to: M,C,A,J Full handicap.

THE CAPTAIN'S PRIZE: Type and form of competition decided by the reigning Captain. Open to: M,C,A,F.

THE SILVER BOWL: Medal competition held in May. Open to: M,C,A,J with handicaps of 13 and over. Full handicap.

NUNN SCRATCH TROPHY: Played with the May Medal and awarded to the best gross score.

THE PRESIDENT'S PLATES: Foursomes Stableford. Open to: M,C,A. 1/2 combined handicap.

THE ANDERSON TROPHY: Stableford competition held on a Sunday in June. Open to: M,C,A,J Full handicap.

GRANDFATHERS CUP: Played in June medal. Open to M,A; must be a grandfather.

THE ROYDS CUP: (Club Championship) 36-hole stroke play played off scratch. Open to M,C,A,J

SCRIVEN-JEFFRIES TROPHY: 36-hole stroke play played off full handicap. Open to M,C,A,J

THE SLADEN SALVER: Stableford competition held on a Sunday, for players aged 55 and over. Open to: M,A. Full handicap.

THE HAMPDEN BOWL: Medal competition held on first Sunday in August. Open to: M,C,A,J Full handicap.

THE TURNER TASSIE: Bogey competition held on a Sunday in October. Open to: M,C,A,J Full handicap.

THE SILVER GOBLETS: Foursomes medal competition held on a Sunday. Open to: M,C,A. 1/2 combined handicap.

EDINBURGH STABLEFORD: A modified greensomes Stableford competition played on the last Sunday in January. Open to M,C,A. The pair must elect that one plays the second shot on even holes, the other on odd holes. 3/8 of the combined handicap.

MIXED CLUB COMPETITIONS

BERRY BOWLS: Summer knock-out mixed pairs better-ball competition. Open to: M,A 3/4 difference of handicap, ladies add 2 strokes and then apply 3/4 difference of handicap and use men's card.

THE MID-HERTS TANKARDS: Winter knock-out match play competition for mixed foursomes. Open to: M,A,C. 1/2 difference of combined handicap using the men's card.

MID-WEEK MIXED FOURSOMES: Summer knock-out match play competition for mixed foursomes but no matches other than the final may be played on Saturdays or Sundays. Open to: M,C,A,F. 1/2 difference of combined handicap using the men's card.

CAPTAIN'S DAY: Format to be decided by the Captain. Generally open to all adult members.

VAUGHAN VASES: Family foursomes. Open to all members, pairs are members of the same family, one must be an adult. 1/2 combined handicap. Ladies add two strokes before applying 1/2 factor and use men's card.

TURKEY TROT: Stableford better-ball competition on a Saturday in November. Open to all adult members, any combination. 3/4 handicap. Ladies use ladies' card. All day.

THREE CLUB COMPETITION: A 15 hole Stableford competition played on New Year's Day from the yellow tees. Open to all adult members. 3/4 handicap. Ladies use ladies' card and play from red tees. Only two clubs and a putter may be used.

CROSS COUNTRY: A Stableford better-ball competition played on a modified course. Open to all adult members, any combination. 3/4 handicap, ladies have 2 bisques.

TEXAS SCRAMBLE: Medal competition for teams of four. Open to all adult members, any combination.

CLUB COMPETITIONS FOR JUNIORS

DALEY SPRING CUP: Singles knock-out competition for Juniors only, held in the spring. Full handicap difference.

MARRIOTT CUP: A running summer (1st April to 30th September) eclectic competition for Juniors only. 3/4 handicap.

DALEY AUTUMN CUP: Singles knock-out competition for Juniors only, held in the autumn. Full handicap difference.

THE LADY BEACH THOMAS CUP & PLATE: Competition for Juniors only, held during the Easter school holiday. Full handicap. Handicaps 18 and below play for the Cup, over 18 for the Plate.

THE STEER CUP & PLATE: Competition for Juniors only, held late summer. Full handicap. Handicaps 18 and below play for the Cup, over 18 for the Plate.

JUDD SALVER: A putting championship for Juniors only. The first round is stroke play, then the qualifiers play succeeding rounds match play. Played on one evening in the summer.

CLUB COMPETITIONS FOR LADIES

MONTHLY MEDAL: Normally on the first Tuesday of each month in three divisions according to handicap or attached to other competitions.

DAVIS CUP: Summer scratch knock-out for the Club Championship; qualification is by the best score from the March, April and May Medals and the Spring Meeting..

TEMPLE CUP: Summer handicap knock-out competition for all handicaps.

SILVER SALVER: Summer handicap knock-out competition for handicaps plus to 20.

DONALD-WRIGHT ROSE BOWL: Summer handicap knock-out competition for handicaps 21 – 29.

SWALLOW TROPHY: Summer handicap knock-out competition for handicaps 30 – 36

CLUB FOURSOMES: Summer handicap knock-out competition for a maximum combined handicap of 60 per pair.

WEEKEND KNOCK-OUT: Summer knock-out competition played at weekends for all handicaps.

WINTER KNOCK-OUT: Singles knock-out competition for all handicaps.

BARBARA JONES TROPHIES: Winter handicap foursomes knock-out competition for high/low handicaps.

CRYSTAL STABLEFORD: 3-ball team event played in January, February and March.

LE MARE TROPHY: Bogey competition for all handicaps

CORONATION FOURSOMES: Stableford competition, half combined handicap

HELENA SPENCER MEMORIAL CHALLENGE TROPHY: Best net aggregate score at the Spring and Autumn Meetings.

WOLF-DANCER TROPHY: presented by Hannah Burke; shared by the best net winners at the Spring and Autumn Meetings.

A.P. FORD CUP: Best aggregate gross score at Spring and Autumn Meetings.

GLOVER TROPHY: Handicap stroke play competition over 36 holes for all handicaps

CAITHNESS TROPHY: Scratch stroke play competition over 36 holes played in conjunction with the Glover Trophy

JOHN LLOYD CUP: Stableford competition for all handicaps

REES/GREGORY STROKE PLAY CHAMPIONSHIP: Stroke play competitions, gross and net, 36 holes over 2 days

JUBILEE PLATE: – Handicap stroke play competition for all handicaps

LADY CAPTAIN'S DAY:

- LADY CAPTAIN'S TROPHY - Best overall score
- WILKINSON CUP - Best score for handicaps 30 –36
- CAPTAIN'S CANDLESTICKS - Best score by a past Captain.

JUDY GEORGE TROPHY: Summer stableford competition for all handicaps.

MILLENNIUM TROPHY: Stroke play gross and net played concurrently.

KAYE TREVOR TROPHY: Greensome stableford competition for all handicaps.

HOWELL TROPHY: Handicap stroke play competition for all handicaps

MALDWYN JONES CUP: Stroke play competition for medal winners.

HOLDEN SALVER: Stableford competition for over 55's.

SLATER TROPHY: Stableford competition for grannies.

CROWDER-CLARK-DEW (CCD) TROPHY

HOLLINGTON TROPHY: For over 70's. Stableford competition.

CARNELL/CARTER 4BBB TROPHY: Stableford competition for all handicaps.

CLAY PUTTING TROPHY: In conjunction with a Summer Medal.

BUCKNALL TROPHY: Stableford, competed for at Seniors Spring Meeting.

BARDSWELL TROPHY: Stableford, competed for at Seniors Autumn Meeting.

GENERAL NOTES ON COMPETITIONS

TEES: All men's competitions are played from the White markers unless stated otherwise, all ladies competitions (including ladies playing in mixed competitions), from the Red.

STARTING POINTS (WEEKEND COMPETITIONS): Unless otherwise stated on the notice board, all 4 starting points may be used.

SINGLES STROKE PLAY (MEDAL, STABLEFORD AND BOGEY) COMPETITIONS: Must be played in 2 or 3-balls. 2-balls have no priority. 4-ball betterball games are permitted on weekend competition days in the afternoon except during the Silver Goblets and President's Plates foursome competitions.

STARTING POINTS (MONDAY MEDAL/STABLEFORD): Appropriate starting places to be used. Must be played in 2 or 3-balls. Any Fourball must play 'Betterball' format

MEN'S AND MIXED COMPETITIONS: Played all day unless shown otherwise in the fixture list.

HANDICAPS: A member without an official CONGU handicap must submit at least 3 Mid-Herts cards marked and signed by a member for allocation of a handicap. To qualify for entry to a Club knock-out competition, a member must have an active handicap.

ENTRIES: A player must register his intention to compete by entering his name in the book provided and paying the entry fee before going out to play. Players must return all cards, including "No Returns", from qualifying competitions. A player must play with a member who is also eligible for the same competition.

TIES IN MATCHPLAY COMPETITION: Will be decided by extra holes played in sequence from the 1st hole played in the match, with handicap strokes as allocated as in the first 18 holes.

TIES IN STROKE PLAY COMPETITION: Will be decided by card countback as follows:-

- 18 hole competition to be decided on the last 9,6,3 or 1 hole(s)
- Royd's to be decided on a four hole play off on holes 1,2, 17 & 18. If that does not produce a result then sudden death over the same four holes

If the result is still a tie, there will be joint winners of the prize money but the trophy will be awarded on a countback, hole by hole, from the final hole.

KNOCK-OUT COMPETITIONS: In order not to hold up the overall competition, it is the competitors' joint responsibility to arrange matches to play these in good time, and enter the result on the competition sheet before the stated deadline. Failure to do this will result in disqualification.

COUNTRY MEMBERS: May play in but may not win any club competitions

USE OF CADDIES & BUGGIES: May be used in all competitions except the Royds/Scriven Jefferies 36 hole competition. (Registered disabled players may make use of a buggy at any time)

JUNIOR ENTRIES:

- i) Junior members with a Club handicap of 18 or less may enter Monthly and Weekday Medal Competitions; they may also play in the Eclectic.
- ii) A Junior member with an official Club handicap of 12 or less may enter other specified Club competitions. Scorecards will be issued from the Professional's shop where full information regarding competitions will be available.
- iii) Junior members playing in Club competitions must play with, and have their cards marked by, an adult member who is eligible for the competition and who ideally is not a parent.
- iv) Juniors playing in Club competitions will not pay an entry fee and may not win monetary prizes (including shop credit and vouchers).

WEEKEND RULES

- (1) Juniors may play after 12 noon on Saturday and Sunday during the winter months and after 12.30 pm on Saturday and Sunday during the summer months. Those with a handicap of 12 or less may also play on Saturday and Sunday mornings.
- (2) Associate members may play before 12 noon on Sundays on payment of the appropriate green fee, provided they are playing with a member who is entitled to play.
- (3) Five-day members may play at weekends on payment of the appropriate green fee, provided they are playing with a member who is entitled to play.
- (4) After 12.30 pm on Sunday, a Five-day member may play on payment of the appropriate green fee without an eligible member and may also introduce a guest at the appropriate green fee.
- (5) Summer is defined as the period starting from the date on which the clocks change in March to that on which the clocks change in October. The rest of the year is winter.

GENERAL REGULATIONS

1. All tee reservations for any Match, competition or society must be respected at all times, including when those groups are passing other starting tees.
2. Play from the White Tees is available to Gentlemen Members and their guests at all times, otherwise the Yellow Tees are the 'Tees of the Day'.
2. Outside of competitions, and in the best interests of golf enjoyment, Gentlemen Members and Guests may, if so desired, play from Red tees and Ladies may enjoy the challenge and play from Yellow tees.
3. Inter-club matches and other groups playing greensomes shall use the 4-ball side of the course.
4. A society playing on a Thursday afternoon will normally start from the 2-ball start points even though playing 3- or 4-balls. Members' 2-balls will not have priority.
5. Members playing on a summer Wednesday afternoon should check at the professional shop and start their round at the place which best avoids delay to those members playing the Eclectic competition.
6. Mobile phones may be used in the car park but not in the clubhouse; they may be used on the course only in the event of a medical emergency.
7. Single players may, if they wish, play one or two balls, but they must not delay the play of other players.
8. Priority on the course is determined by a groups pace of play. Faster groups, irrespective of size, should be invited to pass slower groups. The term group includes a single player.
9. Cars may only be driven to the practice ground for a lesson with the professional
10. Golf shoes, holdalls and golf bags are not allowed in the lounge or casual bar nor may they be left in the entrance hall or the lobby leading to the changing rooms.

DRESS REGULATIONS

The Dress regulations are designed to ensure that **all members, guests and visitors** are smart, clean and tidy in their appearance both on and off the Course and we ask everyone to acquaint themselves with the current regulations published in the Clubhouse.

NOTES

1. Members must sign the green fee book when introducing guests, and ensure that the appropriate fee is paid, before playing.
2. The green fee for a Five-day member to play at a weekend, or an Associate member playing on a Sunday morning will be at the Members Guest Rate. (see Weekend Rules 2, 3 & 4)
3. Any member introducing a guest at the weekend or on a public holiday must be eligible to play at such times and must play with the guest on the day.
4. A member may introduce up to three guests on any day, but must play with them. At weekends and Public holidays this will be subject to course availability.
5. No one guest may be introduced at reduced rates more than six times in any one year.

THE RULES OF READY GOLF

INTRODUCTION

We all know what Ready Golf is, don't we?

It means playing our shots when we're ready. Right? WRONG?

Ready Golf means THINKING AHEAD so that you're READY TO PLAY when it is YOUR TURN.

Ready Golf applies EVERYWHERE on the golf course -- on the tees, on the fairways and on the greens.

ON THE TEE

Ready Golf, we often hear, means that the person who is ready at the tee should hit first. That is simply not true. Ready Golf means that the player with the honour should be READY to HIT FIRST. If the player with the honour isn't ready, only then should someone else hit first.

ON THE FAIRWAY

Ready Golf means that ALL golfers should go to their balls as soon as possible and get READY to play their shots. While waiting to hit, PLAYERS should SURVEY their shot, SELECT their clubs, TAKE them from their bags, and STAND at their balls READY to step up and make the shot when it is their turn. That's Ready Golf!

Hint: Walk down the sides of the fairway to reach your ball, determine your club selection while waiting, and then move towards the centre to your ball. You can usually get close to your ball and get ready to play the shot, while players behind you can still make their shots.

HELPING TO FIND LOST BALLS

It is important that everyone try to help out to find a lost ball in order to keep playing moving. But players should do it AFTER hitting their shots, not BEFORE. How often do you see four players searching for a lost ball, while NONE of them are getting ready to hit?

ENTERING AND EXITING GREENS

ALWAYS, and we mean ALWAYS, leave clubs at the back or side of the Green closest to the next tee. NOTHING is MORE ANNOYING than watching players walk to the FRONT of a Green to retrieve their clubs AFTER everyone has putted out. AND don't stand around chatting and writing down scores either. After the group has putted, go to the next tee, so the group behind can play their shots.

SPEEDING PLAY ON THE GREENS

Playing Ready Golf around the Greens means getting READY to putt BEFORE it is your turn! Players should line up their putts WHILE other players are putting, so they're ready to putt when it's their turn.

If you miss a putt by one or two feet, for example, and have an open stance to make the next putt, you should MAKE the putt INSTEAD of MARKING the ball and waiting for another turn -- unless it is a tricky putt and you want extra time to survey it.

Ready Golf DOES NOT mean RUSHING.

If you prepare in advance to putt, you can take your time AND play Ready Golf.

FARTHEST FROM THE HOLE

There is no reason Ready Golfers can't play in the order of who is farthest from the hole. In Ready Golf, the person farthest from the hole should be READY to play first.

SUMMARY

Ready Golf means BEING READY to play, not playing when you're ready. Here are some simple rules.

1. Walk to your ball as soon as possible, so that you can choose your club and think about the shot in ADVANCE, not when it is your turn.
2. When driving a buggy, drop off your partner first, let your partner choose their club, and then drive to your own ball to get READY to play.
3. When a ball is lost, hit your shot FIRST and then help look for the lost ball.
4. Walk down the SIDES of the fairway to reach your ball and then APPROACH it from the centre. NEVER play in a caravan, moving in a group from ball to ball.
5. When on the Green, line up your putt BEFORE it is your turn, and putt out immediately instead of marking, if you are not in someone else's line.

Mid-Herts Golf Club Rules of the Club

After amendments at The AGM 2010
Effective 26th April 2010

1. Name

The name of the Club is the Mid-Herts Golf Club [hereinafter called 'the Club'] and is a Members Club affiliated to the English Golf Union and the English Women's Golf Association.

2. Objects

The Club's object is to promote the game of golf by adopting the Rules of Golf approved by the Royal and Ancient Golf Club and to maintain a golf club for the accommodation of the Members by providing facilities for golf and social amenities, together with all privileges, advantages and conveniences consistent with a members' golf club. The Club is a non-profit making organisation. All profit and surpluses will be used to maintain or improve the Club's facilities. No profit or surplus will be distributed other than to another non-profit making body or to members on winding up or dissolution of the Club.

3. Management of the Club

(a) Management of the Club will be vested in two separate bodies, namely a Board of Management responsible for the management and control of the course, property, funds, finances, Membership and administration of the Club and a Captain's Committee responsible for all golfing and social activities of the Club.

(b) Each of the Board of Management and the Captain's Committee shall meet for the despatch of its business and regulate its meetings, including the filling of vacancies and co-option of additional Members until the next Annual General Meeting, as it thinks fit. Four Members shall be a quorum for the Board of Management and five in the case of the Captain's Committee.

4. Board of Management

(a) Without prejudice to the generality of the preceding paragraph, the Board of Management shall have the following specific powers:

- (i) to appoint a General Manager and determine his or her duties which will include accepting the post of Secretary to Mid-Herts Golf Club Limited (the "Company") and to fix his or her remuneration and other terms and conditions of service by legal contract
- (ii) to engage, control and dismiss all paid employees of the Club
- (iii) to impose restrictions as to times and days on which golf may be played and other restrictions and conditions to apply either generally or for such categories of Members or visitors as the Board of Management may decide, not extending to the arrangements for playing Members competitions or matches

- (iv) to direct the Company in the management of its assets but in all matters subject to Rule 11
 - (v) to draw up such Bye-Laws as they consider necessary for the management, conduct and well being of the Club, to publish the current Bye-Laws in the Annual Club Diary and to alter or rescind the same by notice placed on the general notice board at the Club or by such other means by which the change can be notified to Members. Any such change shall have effect until set aside by Members in General Meeting
 - (vi) to exercise all such executive and administrative powers as may be necessary for properly carrying out the objects of the Club and which are not by these Rules expressed to be done or exercised by the Captain's Committee, the Ladies Committee or by the Club in General Meeting
 - (vii) to implement the recommendations of the Captain's Committee and the Ladies Committee in respect of the candidates for Membership.
- (b) The Board of Management shall consist of four voting Members elected by Members in General Meeting together with the Captain, a nominee of the Ladies section and the Honorary Treasurer, all with equal voting rights. They shall appoint a chairman from one of the four elected Members. The elected Members shall serve for a period of four years but notwithstanding this at least one of the elected Members shall retire annually but shall be eligible for re-election, the Member so to retire being the longest in office. As between Members who have been in office the same length of time, the retiring Member shall be chosen by lot.

5. Captain's Committee

- (a) The Captain's Committee shall be responsible for:
- (i) the arrangements of golf competitions and matches of the Club
 - (ii) the handicapping of all male Members
 - (iii) the promotion and encouragement of the Junior section of the Club
 - (iv) the conduct of Members in the Clubhouse and on the course
 - v) the social events and activities of the Club
 - (vi) appointing one or more interview committees consisting of at least three persons, at least one of whom shall be a member of the Captain's Committee, to consider all applications for Membership of the Club made in accordance with the rules. The interview committee shall forward the applications of those they propose to accept to the Board of Management for implementation.
- (b) The Captain's Committee shall consist of the Captain, who shall be Chairman, the Vice Captain, the Immediate Past Captain, a nominee of the Ladies Section, six elected voting Members and the Honorary Treasurer. The elected Members shall serve for a period of three years but notwithstanding this at least two of the elected Members shall retire annually but shall be eligible for re-election, the Members so to retire being the longest in office. As between Members who have been in office the same length of time, the retiring Members shall be chosen by lot.

6. Office Bearers

- (a) A President and Vice President shall be elected by the Members in General Meeting and shall serve for a period of three years. They will be Full Members of the Club of at least ten years' standing. They shall be charged with the overall and long term welfare of the Club and the maintenance of its Rules in the pursuit of its objectives but shall have no role in the day to day management of the Club. In the event of a vacancy occurring (i) in the office of President, the Vice President shall assume his/her duties and authorities, or (ii) in the office of Vice President, the President shall assume his/her duties and authorities, in each case in addition to his/her own until the vacancy is filled at the next General Meeting of the Club.
- (b) The Captain and Vice Captain each of whom shall be a Full Member and have served on the Captain's Committee or Board of Management shall be appointed and elected, respectively, annually at the Annual General Meeting to hold office until the following Annual General Meeting. The Vice Captain once elected shall be Captain for the year following his/her year as Vice Captain.
- (c) The Honorary Treasurer, who shall be a Member (and if a Non-Voting Member shall previously have been a Voting Member) and shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting for a period of three years, after which he/she shall retire but will be eligible for re-election.
- (d) The Independent Examiner, who shall either be a suitably qualified external person or firm or shall be or shall have been a Voting Member, and shall be elected at the Annual General Meeting for the following year, after which he/she shall retire but will be available for re-election. The Independent Examiner shall be responsible for examining the annual accounts of the Club and issuing the statement referred to in Rule 10(a).

7. Membership

Membership is divided into the following categories:

- (a) Refer to the Bye-Laws for special playing conditions for Tuesday and Sunday Mornings.
- (b) Members under 18 years of age at subscription renewal date.
- (c) Members over 18 and under 25 years of age at subscription renewal date.
- (d) A Retired Member is entitled to a reduction in annual subscription having reached the age of 70 and having been a member for 10 years. This category has been closed to new entrants since January 2000.
- (e) Available to established Members whose place of residence is not within 40 miles of the Clubhouse.
- (f) A Member who is entitled to use the Clubhouse facilities but has no privileges on the course.
- (g) At the discretion of the Captain's Committee and with the agreement of the Board of Management, Honorary Membership may be accorded to members who have given long and distinguished or exceptional service to the Club.

8. Election of Members, Fees & Subscriptions

- (a) Applicants for Membership shall be proposed by such Members and on such terms as the Captain's Committee shall from time to time determine. The Captain's Committee may also determine to hold Open Days or other activities at which applications for membership are sought. All proposal forms shall be posted for fourteen days on the main notice board before the application is considered.
- (b) Membership of the Club is open to all the community irrespective of their age, gender, ability, race, religious or political beliefs, ethnic origin, colour, social status, or sexual orientation, without discrimination, except as a necessary consequence of the requirements of the game of golf. All applications will be considered by the interview committee appointed in accordance with Rule 5 (a) (vi). Election shall be made by a simple majority of the interview committee.
- (c) Entrance Fees and Annual Subscriptions for all classes of Membership shall be fixed by the Board of Management except that no increase which results in the potential total annual subscriptions for the year (based on the membership at the time the decision is taken by the Board) exceeding the total annual subscriptions for the previous year (based on the same membership) by more than 10 % may be instituted except by the ordinary resolution of Members in General Meeting. The Board shall have discretion to increase fees and subscriptions not paid within two months of the subscription renewal date by up to 10% and to determine that those members who fail to pay within three months of the subscription renewal date shall cease to be members of the Club.
- (d) A Member having paid his/her subscription shall thereby be held to submit to the Rules, Bye Laws and Regulations of the Club.
- (e) The Captain's Committee shall have the power to remove or suspend from the List of Members anyone who has committed any act prejudicial to the well being and good order of the Club.
- (f) When any Member is expelled, suspended or resigns from the Club, there will be no entitlement to any refund of subscription or fees other than any outstanding loan from that Member.

9.1 General Meetings of the Club

- (a) An Annual General Meeting of the Club shall be held each year at such time (not being more than 15 months after the holding of the preceding Annual General Meeting and not more than four months after the date of the annual accounts) and at such place as the Board of Management may decide. Notice of the date of the Annual General Meeting shall be placed on the Notice Board thirty-five days before its date. At least 21 days' notice shall be given by the General Manager to each Member, such notice to contain a copy of the Annual Report and Accounts, the Independent Examiner's report thereon, a form of proxy for use at the meeting (if required), any ordinary resolutions to be placed before the meeting and the names of all candidates nominated for President, Vice President, Vice Captain, Honorary Treasurer,

Independent Examiner and all other candidates nominated for the Captain's Committee, and to fill vacancies on the Board of Management together with the names of their respective proposers and seconders.

- (b) Nominations for Office Bearers, the Board of Management and the Captain's Committee shall require a proposer and one seconder. Nominations for the Board of Management shall also be supported by a curriculum vitae of the nominee. No Member may be elected to both the Board of Management and the Captain's Committee. A Member may propose or second only one candidate for election to the Board of Management and one Member for the Captain's Committee at each Annual General Meeting.
- (c) The business of the Annual General Meeting, for which fifty Members entitled to vote, present in person or by proxy, shall form a quorum, shall be limited to:-
- (i) the confirmation of the minutes of the previous Annual General Meeting and any other General Meetings since the last Annual General Meeting which shall be circulated to all Members with the Notice of the Meeting
 - (ii) matters arising out of these minutes
 - (iii) the submission of the Annual Report, Accounts and Three Year Rolling Plan.
 - (iv) when necessary the election of President and/or Vice President
 - (v) the election of a Vice Captain for the ensuing year
 - (vi) when necessary the election of an Honorary Treasurer
 - (vii) the election of candidates to fill vacancies on the Board of Management
 - (viii) the election of candidates to fill vacancies on the Captain's Committee
 - (ix) the election of Independent Examiner/s for the following year
 - (x) any motions, or ordinary resolutions to amend the Rules of the Club for which the notice has been given
 - (xi) to receive comments from the Members
- (d) (i) All resolutions shall be ordinary resolutions and shall be determined by a simple majority of those present (in person or by proxy) and entitled to vote except resolution(s) to alter Rule 11
- (ii) Any change or amendment to Rule 11 shall require a Special Resolution which shall require a majority of 75% of the members present (in person or by proxy) and entitled to vote at the meeting. Any meeting called to consider a Special Resolution shall require a quorum of not less than 75% of the voting Membership of the Club present in person or by proxy and the notice required for such meeting shall be sixty days.
- (iii) The Board of Management may make proper arrangements for proxy voting and/or voting by email or similar electronic communication at any general meeting in accordance with this Rule. Each form of proxy may

appoint the Chairman or any other voting member as his or her proxy and shall be delivered to the General Manager's office at least 48 hours before the time of the general meeting. The voting member appointed as proxy (or the Chairman if appointed as proxy) shall vote as directed in the form of the proxy but, if there is no such direction, may vote as he or she thinks fit. A member who has delivered a form of proxy shall be entitled to vote if he or she decides to attend the meeting in which case the proxy form shall be of no effect.

- (e) Any voting Member may bring forward a motion or motions relating to the management of the Club subject to the motion being seconded by one other voting Member and giving the General Manager 28 clear days notice in writing. The General Manager shall place a copy of the motion[s] on the notice board at least 21 days before the meeting.
- (f) The Board of Management may, on giving 28 days notice, call an Extraordinary General Meeting and shall be bound to do so not more than 28 days after receiving a requisition signed by at least 50 voting Members stating the object for which they require the meeting to be called; or if required for any reason by the President and Vice President acting together. The quorum for such a meeting shall be 50 members present in person or by proxy and entitled to vote.
- (g) if the purpose of the Extraordinary General Meeting is to consider a Special Resolution, Rule 9(f) shall still apply, but the provisions of Rule 9(d)(ii) shall apply as to the length of notice and quorum required.
- (h) All Members are entitled to attend General Meetings and notice of such meetings will be sent to all Members.
- (i) The Chairman of all General Meetings of the Club shall be the President or in his/her absence the Vice President or, in their absence, any Voting Member elected by the meeting. The Chairman shall have a casting vote in the event of equality of votes on any ordinary resolution.

9.2 Proceedings at General Meetings

- (a) If the requisite quorum is not present within half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting, the meeting shall stand adjourned to the same time, place and day in the next week and those members present at such adjourned meeting shall constitute the quorum.
- (b) The Chairman may, with the consent of a meeting, adjourn the meeting for any reason for not more than seven days.
- (c) In the case of adjournment under either paragraph(a) or (b) it shall not be necessary to give notice of the adjourned meeting, but no business may be conducted at the adjourned meeting other than business which might properly have been transacted at the meeting had the adjournment not taken place.
- (d) A resolution put to the meeting shall be decided on a show of hands, unless before, or on the declaration of the result of, the show of hands a poll is duly demanded. A poll may be demanded;
- (i) by the Chairman

- (ii) by at least ten members having the right to vote at the meeting and a demand by a person as proxy for a member shall be the same as a demand by the member.
- (e) A poll shall be taken in such manner as the Chairman directs. The results of a poll shall over-rule any result of a show of hands on the resolution in question.
- (f) A declaration by the Chairman that a resolution has been carried unanimously, or by a particular majority, or lost or not carried by a particular majority and an entry to that effect in the minutes of the meeting, shall be conclusive evidence of that fact.
- (g) Any proposed amendment to an ordinary resolution shall only be considered at the Meeting if it has been submitted in writing to the General Manager, signed by at least two Voting Members, at least 14 clear days before the meeting. The General Manager shall place a copy of the proposed amendment on the Notice Board as soon as practicable after receiving it. A proposed Special Resolution shall not be capable of amendment

10. Financial Matters

- (a) The Board of Management shall have overall responsibility for the finances of the Club. The Honorary Treasurer shall be responsible for keeping proper records of the Club's financial transactions. The Chairman of the Board of Management shall be responsible for presenting the Annual Report and Three Year Plan and the Honorary Treasurer shall be responsible for presenting the annual accounts to the Annual General Meeting. The annual accounts shall contain a report by the Independent Examiner that no matter has come to their attention which gives them reasonable cause to believe that in any material respect the Board of Management's responsibilities (i) to keep accounting records and (ii) to prepare annual accounts which accord with the accounting records and comply with applicable accounting standards and these Rules, have not been met; or to which in their opinion, attention should be drawn in order to enable a proper understanding of the annual accounts to be reached.
- (b) The Board of Management shall have powers to borrow money for normal Club purposes from the Club's banker or any recognised commercial lender on such terms and conditions as they see fit, except that any borrowing for expenditure in excess of 12.5% of the subscription income for the previous financial year, shall require the prior approval of Members in General Meeting.

11. Land

- (a) The freehold title to all land owned by the Club is vested in the Company which is a registered trustee company limited by shares and governed by its Memorandum and Articles of Association. The Board of Management shall have responsibility for maintaining financial and fiduciary relationship between the Club and the Company, but shall not direct the Company to sell, transfer, lease or otherwise dispose of any land or buildings comprising the assets of the Company, except with the prior approval of a Special Resolution of the Club in General Meeting.

- (b) In the event of a Special Resolution requiring the dissolution of the Club being carried, the Board of Management and the Directors of the Company shall proceed to realise the property and assets of the Club and after discharging all liabilities, shall divide the net proceeds of realisation under the joint supervision of the Independent Examiner of the Club and the Directors of the Company amongst Members as at the date of the General Meeting, rateably in proportion to the aggregate amount each such Member has paid in annual subscriptions over the past ten years immediately preceding that date and after such division the Club shall be dissolved and the Company wound up.

12. Ladies Section

Subject to the foregoing Rules of the Club and any relevant Bye Laws imposed by the Board of Management, the Ladies section shall appoint their own Captain, office bearers and Committee Members as are required and under such rules as the Lady Members shall determine, to regulate their handicaps, matches, meetings, competitions and any other matters solely concerning the Ladies Section.

13. Indemnity

The Club shall indemnify out of its assets any and all liabilities, actions, proceedings, claims, costs, demands, damages and expenses (including legal fees) incurred by or threatened against any Office Bearer, Member of the Board of Management or Captain's Committee or employee of the Club as a result of discharging the duties of their office, except for any liability incurred through misconduct of fraud on their part.

14. Supply of Intoxicating Liquor

Alcoholic liquor may be served to Members on the Club premises only during permitted hours. Details will be displayed in the bar. Subject to any restrictions which may from time to time be imposed by the Board of Management, the following persons shall be entitled to admission to the Club premises and to purchase intoxicating liquor, viz:-

- (a) Golfers on payment of the appropriate Green Fee
- (b) Those taking table meals in the Club premises
- (c) Those attending any function at the Club premises in whatever capacity,
- (d) Caddies and Club Employees, and,
- (e) Guests of the Club

No person under the age of 18 years may purchase or be supplied with intoxicating liquor.
